Please note: Nomination materials should be submitted in one pdf file to ensure no required material is missing. Nomination Packets are due by February 17, 2023. - 2. Nominating letter (3 pages maximum) addressing the outstanding work and sustained contribution of the nominees mentoring efforts go above and beyond the usual levels of excellent mentorship that is expected of all Ph.D. and postdoctoral mentors at the University of Utah.
- 3. Current curriculum vitae for the nominee (5 pages maximum). The CV should include material that is mentoring focused, including a list of past graduate students/postdoctoral scholars with their placement/position upon leaving the University of Utah.
- 4. At least three, but not more than five, additional letters of support from colleagues and former Ph. D. students, MS Students, and postdoctoral scholars. At least two of these letters should be from current or former mentees.

Names of the letter writers:

5. A letter from the Department Chair or Dean supporting and evaluating the nomination. This letter should address the unique and outstanding aspects of the nominee's work including efforts to increase equity and diversity, inclusivity, leadership, and initiative at the programmatic or community level, etc.
