## **Applicant Tips from ACLS:**

- Read the <u>website</u> thoroughly to understand application instructions and formatting requirements, as well as to log in early to start building your online application;
- Create a checklist of application components and a healthy timeline to complete;
- Match your research plans with the program's objectives;
- Spent quality time on the abstract this is the first impression and should be seen as an additive to the application and <u>not</u> a duplication of other application materials refrain from copying/pasting the first paragraph of the proposal;
- Every piece of the application counts, don't overlook any elements;
- Successful applications focus on research projects and plans, unsuccessful applications discuss ideas for a research project;
- Discuss in the application how 9-12 months as a fellow will be used thoughtfully and efficiently;
- Be clear and direct in your writing, be sure to avoid jargon;
- Ask a friend or colleague to read/proof each draft, in addition to seeking feedback from resources such as faculty advisors and committee;
- Prepare your reference writers to produce a strong letter: provide for them a draft of your proposal as well as a brief overview of the fellowship's mission and objectives;
- Check ACLS <u>FAQ website</u> often (continuously updated);
- Use ACLS <u>online resources</u>, including their <u>fellowship proposal writing guide</u>;
